## PARKING

Over the past couple of weeks we have had more and more local residents, neighbours to us at school, contacting us regarding inconsiderate and dangerous parking, particularly at peak times of the day, like drop off and collection times. Some people are parking in private parking bays, on double yellow lines, across access points, and on verges. Whilst we realise that it is not always parents of children at our school who are causing all of these issues, on many occasions the evidence suggests that parents are involved quite frequently.

The situation in the school car park is also becoming more and more dangerous with double parking, queues forming and as such is blocking access to and from local houses.

The management of this is taking a great deal of time and negotiation and is having an impact on our ability to deal with other school and learning related issues. So we **urge** you to:

- \* Walk wherever possible
- \* Leave in plenty of time to allow you to find a suitable and safe place to park
- \* Avoid using the school car park (**this will not be available to use for drop off at all at peak times from September 2018 so please start to avoid from now to ensure you have a plan for then**)
- \* Use streets a little bit further away from school where there is often plenty of parking
- \* Not park in private parking spaces
- \* Not park on verges or on double yellow lines however brief you anticipate being
