Curriculum Enrichment

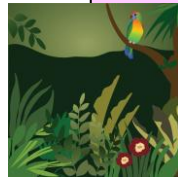
Wow Day:

The children will have a WOW day on the 29th November based on our class text: Charlie and the Chocolate factory. The children will be asked to come in fancy dress and will carry out exciting activities that link to our English and D&T learning.



Learning Environment

The children will have the opportunity this term to design and make their own chocolates using selected ingredients of their choice. They will also get the chance to do some baking and follow some recipes to make rock cakes and pizzas. Children will be expected to work together in small groups when making chocolates.



Texts

This term the children will be writing some of their own poems about their favourite foods. As well as this, we will be reading Roald Dahl's: Charlie and the Chocolate Factory as our class text. The children will use this as a stimulus for Narrative writing and Newspaper report writing.



Home Learning

Children will be set weekly spellings that will be sent home every Friday and tested the following week in class on a Thursday or Friday. As well as this, another piece of homework will be sent home on Friday and due in on Wednesday (to allow time for marking).

Homework set will be related to the learning done in class or will be used as a pre-learning tool.



British Values



Mutual Respect: children will be encouraged to discuss and consider how their own actions affect others through the teaching of PSHE and Religious Education. We will look closely at Christianity and the Hindu faith and consider how we exercise being tolerant of others.

Making a Difference to our World

Throughout our topic, year three will look at where different foods come from and in particular looking at how the development of Fairtrade products assist in fighting poverty and provide better working conditions for people in other countries.

Year 3 Cycle A Term 1

Topic Overview

This term we will be tucking in and enjoying a journey of discovery, tasting fantastic fruits, vegetables and making some tantalizing treats!

The children will work up an appetite with delicious stories about food; have fun with fruit and vegetables, as well as getting busy baking in the kitchen to discover how good food helps you grow fit and strong.

English, Science and D&T

Programmes of Study

English

This term the children will create a poem about their favourite foods using similes and metaphors. They will also follow instructions to make some pizzas and create a set of instructions based on an imaginary sweet treat. As well as this we will be reading Roald Dahl's - Charlie and the Chocolate Factory as our class text.

Maths

This term we will be developing our written methods for multiplication and division as well as looking at different units of measure when weighing and measuring out our ingredients for baking. We will also be working hard with the children to improve their mental calculation skills, in particular our times tables.

Geography

As part of our Geography learning we will be looking at foods from across the globe. We will learn about where cocoa beans come from and how they grow as well as how they are turned into chocolate.

History

John Cadbury will be the focus of the history element of this half term's topic. We will learn about the history of chocolate and use this as a starting point for our report writing.

Science

We will use our investigation skills to learn about the properties of different foods.
We will practise gathering, recording, classifying and presenting data to answer scientific questions. We will also look at nutrition which will be linked to our PSHE topic.

Art and Design

Throughout this topic we will be investigating different foods and recipes. The children will be designing and making their own 'Scrumdiddlyumptious' creations! They will research, plan, produce, market and evaluate their new tasty product. We will use the wonderful creations of Willy Wonka as a starting point for our own recipes!
We will also be developing our observational drawing skills by sketching our favourite foods this term. The children will have an opportunity to use a variety of media to experiment with colours and lines.
