Romans and Tudors are loving our 'Freedom and Fury' term. Our learning has whisked us back to King John's England and his conflict with the rebellious Barons. We have learnt how the Magna Carta was created to protect the rights of the people and how its lasting legacy has impacted on our modern, daily lives. In English, our book 'The Invisible' by Tom Percival, has explored loneliness and what it is to show empathy. 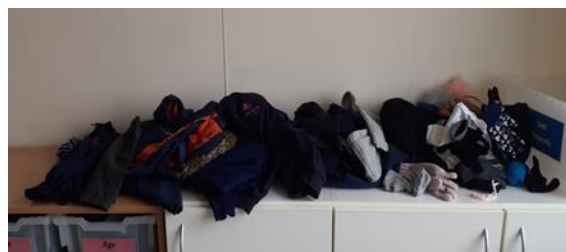


Goodbye Mr. Cotton

Administering Medicine

As a rule, staff will not administer any medication that has not been prescribed and we can only administer medicine if it is a fourth dose. Staff may only administer certain non-prescription medication such as pain relief, under certain circumstances, for example, if a child is recovering from a broken bone.

All medicines supplied to the school by parents must be provided in the original container as dispensed by the pharmacist and include the prescriber's instructions for administration.
